

Fadic Days of the Year

‘Fadic’ that is, ‘fated’ days of the year are those days which correspond numerologically to the number of letters in a person’s first name and the day of the month on which they were born. Fadic days are considered to be auspicious days, on which the native can expect something significant to happen. Fadic days of the year may also be good days to take a risk, a gamble, or to try something new, as such endeavors are more likely to pay off than most other days.

For example, say someone named Maribel was born on the 3rd of the month. The name ‘Maribel’ has seven letters. Thus, all days of the month which harmonize with the number 3—the 3rd, the 12th, the 21st and the 30th of any month—are fadic days for her. The same holds true for those months of the year which correspond to the number 3. Because her name has seven letters, all days of the month and the one month of the year which harmonize with the number 7 may *also* be considered fadic times of the year for her.

REMINDERS: Those dates of the year in which *both* numbers make an appearance are likely to be particularly auspicious. If the Master Numbers 11 and 22 appear in either the person’s first name or day of birth, you have a choice: either leave them as is, or reduce the Master Number to its single digit and proceed accordingly. You may find one option works better than the other. In any event, the days of the month which harmonize with the person’s day of birth will be semi-auspicious days for them in *every* month. The Fadic days of the year will not change from year to year; they will always be the same dates.
