History of This Oracle

Legend has it Napoleon came into possession of this Book of Fate on his campaign into Egypt in the year 1798 C.E. It was reportedly found written on papyrus in an ancient tomb, and Napoleon had a Coptic scholar translate it into the German language. From then until the Battle of Nations in Leipzig in 1813 when he was forced to leave it behind in his retreat, Napoleon never failed to consult the Book of Fate before each battle. As the Prussian officer who found his accompanying diary attested, this oracle had never steered him wrong up until that point. The origin-story of Napoleon's Book of Fate must be considered apocryphal, since no one had a clue how to translate ancient Egyptian hieroglyphs until 20 years later. Its fundamentally binary structure *does* suggest either an African or Asian origin, but the nature of the list of questions and answers in this oracle certainly suggests a more recent origin than the time of the Egyptian pharaohs. Napoleon may well have come across this Book of Fate in Egypt, but it likely wasn't found in an ancient tomb.

How to Use This Oracle

Consult the list of questions which appear on pages 3 and 4 of this document. Choose a question to which you most want an answer. Focus your mind intently on that question for a few moments, asking God/Goddess/Tao/Universe/Spirits to render a true answer to your question. Then with either a stick and a stretch of dusty ground in front of you, or with a paper and your choice of writing implement, make a series of five rows of dots in descending order. Keep your mind blank as you're doing this. Don't count the number of dots you're making as you write them, just do it. You'll count them afterward. See the example below:

As you can see from the example above, when counting the number of dots in a row, an odd number of dots in a row will translate as *one* dot in the final figure. An even number of dots in a row will translate as *two* dots in the final figure. This figure you'll form to the right of the rows of dots. If you do not wish to cast the oracle this way, I have devised a set of cards which you can use instead. Just shuffle them, asking your question, then draw one at random.

When you have your figure erected (or symbol card chosen), you will take that figure to the tables which appear on pages five and six. Across the top of the tables, you will see the thirty-two possible figures for this Book of Fate, listed in numerical order. Find the figure you just drew. Down the left side of the table are listed the numbers of the questions. Find the number for the question you just asked, then drawing your finger down the column from the figure you drew, and another finger right or left-ward along the number- row of the question you asked, where the two meet is the Western alphabet or Greek alphabet letter which represents the page to which you will turn for your answer. When you arrive at the proper page, you will be looking for the symbol you drew, only it will be turned 45 degrees to the left, lying on its side on the left-hand side of the page, with the top dot/dots on the left, and the bottom dot/dots on the right. The sentence to the right of this figure is your answer.

Dates Considered Unlucky for Consulting the Book of Fate

For reasons unknown, there are certain dates which are considered unlucky for consulting this oracle. You may defy this restriction if you wish, but if you want to stay in harmony with the spirit of the oracle, and re-assure yourself of receiving an accurate answer, this restriction ought to be respected. It mostly agrees with the list of forbidden dates which accompanies the abbreviated version of Napoleon's Book of Fate, but there are a few differences. The forbidden dates are as follows:

January 1, 2, 5, 6, 11, 12, 20

February 11, 17, 18

March 4, 16

April 10, 17, 18

May 7, 8

June 17

July 17, 21

August 20, 21

September 10, 18

October 6

November 6, 10

December 6, 11, 15

As you can see from this list, neither the Ides of March (March 15), nor any Friday the 13th are considered unacceptable dates for consulting this Book of Fate, just the dates listed. It's peculiar, but I recommend you follow this injunction anyway, just to be on the safe side.
