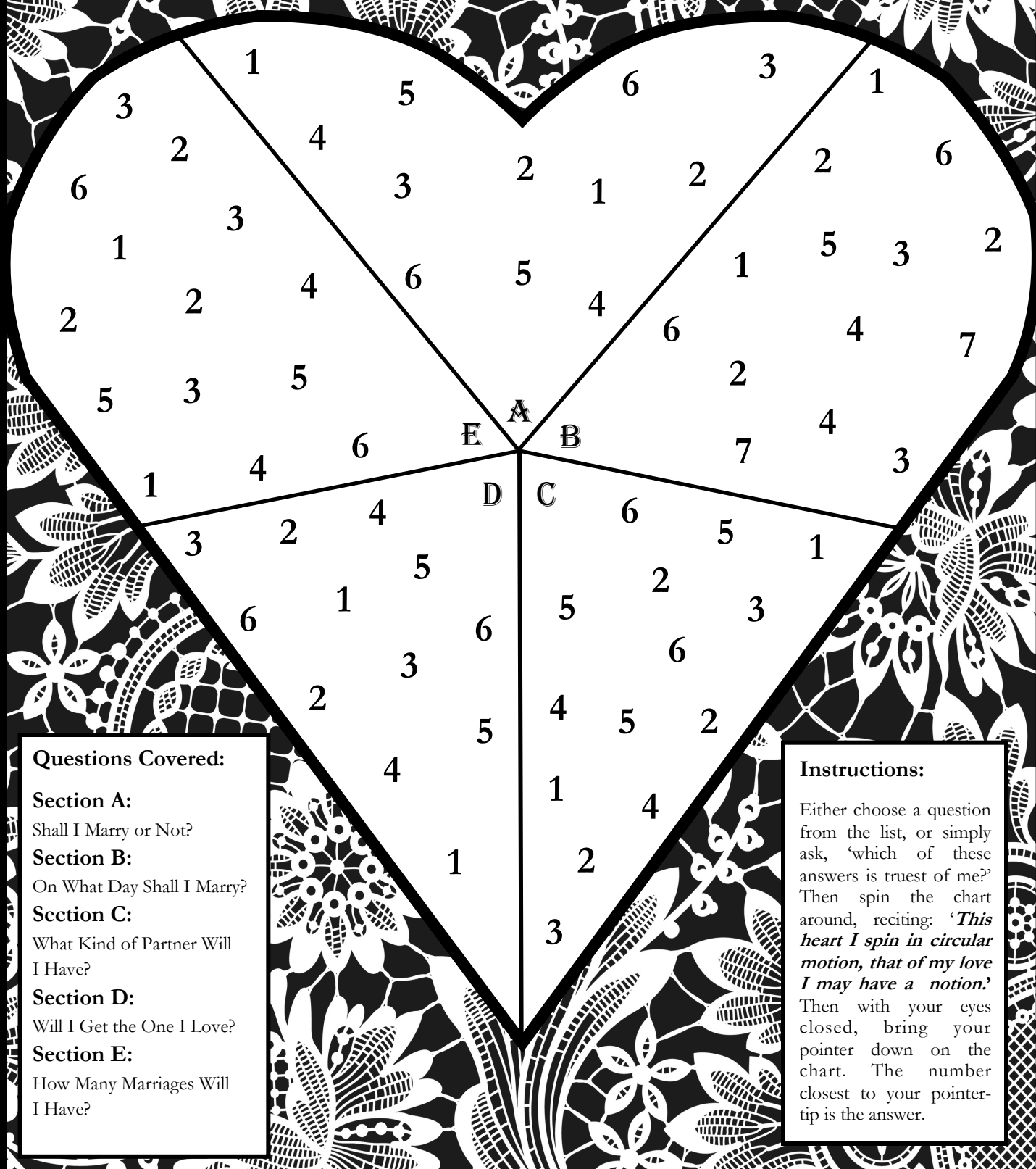


THE MAGIC HEART

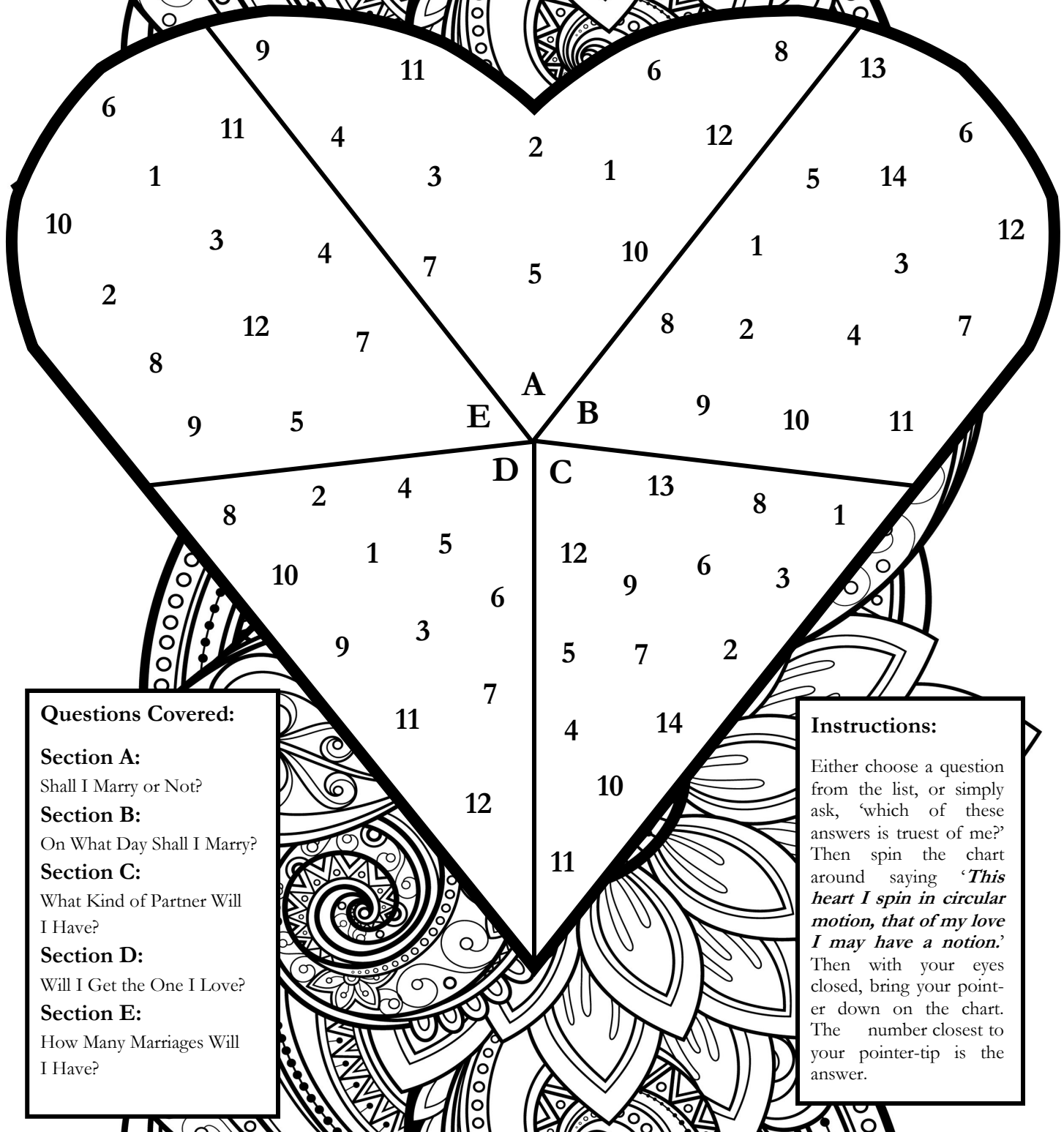
