OF TAGES THE ETRUSCAN

AS TRANSLATED BY PUBLIUS NIGIDIUS FIGULUS FROM THE *HARUSPICINAE DISCIPLINA*, WHICH WAS BASED ON THE SAYINGS OF TAGES OF TARQUINIÏ

“Supposing that publically, in all augural teaching, the ancients assumed the Moon to be a reference point (for under this heading they classified both thunder and lightning signs), one may likewise correctly select the phase of the Moon as a factor for reckoning, so that, beginning with Cancer, we shall make observations of thunder day-by-day, beginning with the first day of the lunar month, and (the) following lunar months. From this study, the Etruscans transmitted local observations with regard to the regions that are struck from the sky by thunder.

How to Use This Calendar

This is a *lunar* calendar, designed to be used starting from the new moon closest to the summer solstice in whichever hemisphere of the planet you live. For the northern hemisphere, this calendar will likely start in June, and for the southern hemisphere, this calendar will likely start in December. Ideally, you are looking for the new moon which starts when the sun is in Cancer for the northern hemisphere, and when the sun is in Capricorn for the southern hemisphere, but as there is usually only one new moon per month, whatever new moon lands closest to the summer solstice should be your presumed starting point.

Identifying the correct starting date of this brontosopic calendar —and it will vary from year-to-year—is very important, for all the subsequent predictions in this calendar are dependent upon your count starting from the correct day. Indeed, you may want to note on the first page of the calendar what day the starting-new moon landed on, in order to make counting easier.

You'll notice every month is allotted 30 days; those are for the up-to 30 days it takes the moon to complete a lunar month. You'll find these lunar months always straddle two of our normal months, which is how there can be a 30th day of the moon's age in the month of February. Close attention to the phases of the moon is needed in order to use this calendar correctly. This shouldn't be too hard, as there now exist Internet websites which are more than happy to let you know what phase the moon is in on any particular day.

This brontosopic calendar was the product of a heavily-agricultural society, and most of the predictions reflect this. You may have to take the prediction for a given day as metaphorical, and interpret it accordingly.

You'll notice this calendar only has predictions for 360 days, and our year is 365 days long. In that case, you may have to determine the date of the moon's age, then find the current (and previous and following) calendar month(s), then do some counting back or counting forward. The correct prediction may be part of the previous calendar month's lunar days sequence, or at the start of the next month's lunar days sequence.
