

Omen-Taking — Finding Money Exercises

Using what you've learned from the lesson & the attached PDF, give your honest interpretation of the message behind the following money-finding scenarios:

On an errand one day, you spy a fifty-cent coin face-up and two one-cent coins face-down on the sidewalk on your right. It means?...

Approaching a vending machine, you notice there is thirty-cents change in the coin return. If in the U.S., assume it's a quarter and a nickel. If in a Euro-currency country, assume it's twenty-cent coin and a ten-cent coin. Given where you found the money, and the meanings of the specific coins, and their numerological significance, what message do you derive from this?

You could've *sworn* your wallet was empty, but when you look in there by chance, there's a five-dollar bill or a five-euro note staring back at you. Given the specific value of the currency and where you found it, what message do you derive from this?

Idly reaching between the sofa cushions while watching television, you find twenty-three cents, two ten-cent coins and three one-cent coins. What message do you derive from this?

Out on a rainy day, you spot a one-dollar coin or a one-euro coin, face-down, on the pavement to your left. A little further up, also on the left, is another one-dollar or one-euro coin, only this one is face-up. Given the coinage and where you found it, what message do you derive from this?

While walking toward the front gates of a cemetery, after paying your respects to the deceased, you find a five-dollar or five-euro note. Given the value of the currency and where you found it, what message do you derive from this?
